Since 1965, UMAIE has offered unique opportunities for cross-cultural study during January Term. UMAIE, a consortium of colleges and universities, cooperates to provide the educational depth and resources necessary for an intercultural curriculum. This year UMAIE offers courses in many locations around the world including: The Americas (North and South), Africa, Asia and the South Pacific and Europe (Western, **Central, Eastern and Southern).** The comprehensive fee includes round-trip air transportation from Minneapolis-St. Paul to the course location; airport transfers; visas (where required for U.S. citizens who meet the visa application deadline and have the correct accompanying documentation); transportation to most course activities while abroad; lodging, primarily in twin or triple rooms in hotels (or where indicated - guesthouses, university dormitories, tents or family homes); continental breakfast daily (exceptions noted on individual course descriptions) and other meals as indicated; tickets for required theatrical and cultural performances; planned excursions; and administrative costs (however, individual institutions may assess additional charges). All rail passes, entrances and local airfares are based on utilization of youth rates (25 years or under) where possible and any participants who do not qualify for such discounts are responsible for all supplemental costs.

REGISTRATION - Applications are processed through October 1, 2016. EARLY REGISTRATION IS ADVISED, as all courses have enrollment limits and may fill early. T4799 An Andalusian Odyssey: Spanish language study in Southern Spain

T4795 Angels, Sirens and Warriors: Women in Literature and Art in England and France

Through close study of major works of literature and art, this course considers the themes and contradictions that govern the depiction of women in England and France between 1800-1945.

Arab and Jewish Influence in Spain and Morocco T4782

T4797 Archaeology and History in Rome and Croatia

T4801 Berlin Yesterday and Today: From the Third Reich to German Unity

Immerse yourself in the culture and history of the capital of Germany, as you build your language skills, historical knowledge, and (inter-)cultural understanding through active learning and hands-on investigation.

T4796 The Chemistry of Brewing in Belgium and Germany

Brussels, Orval, Munich

The physical, organic, and biochemistry of the beer brewing process will be examined and explained via lectures, labs, and site visits to breweries.

T4802 Comparative Politics of Central Europe

The course will examine the political and cultural developments in Poland, Belarus, and Lithuania since the collapse of the Soviet Union.

T4783 Eastern Europe: Cultural Trauma, Communications, and the Camera

Anna Reich and Tasha Rennels, Augustana University Vilnius, Warsaw, Krakow, Hamburg, Frankfurt

This course will analyze how photography can inspire communication that sheds insight into how Holocaust survivors and victims of the Soviet Occupation in Eastern Europe deal with trauma and process grief.

Families in Italian Society T4806

Naples and Rome

This course provides a deep immersion into the everyday life experience of Italian families in Naples and Rome, while using families as a lens through which to explore contemporary Italian culture.

T4786 Mozart, Beethoven and Beyond: The Music and Culture of Vienna, Prague, and Budapest David DeVasto and Scott Uddenberg, Elmhurst College

Vienna, Salzburg, Prague, Budapest

Experience the musical heritage of the former Austro-Hungarian Empire through a unique cultural perspective that will engage all of your senses.

T4803 Olympic Literature and History Connecting the Ancient and Modern Games in Greece

Athens, Nafplio, Olympia and Delphi

Explore and experience the literature and history of the ancient and modern Olympic Games while visiting the ruins, temples of the gods, and stadiums of Greece.

T4805 Spooks, Psychics, and Skeptics in the UK: Psychological Science Investigates the Paranormal

London, Edinburgh, Lydney and Inverness

We visit the United Kingdom, a culture unique in its support for scientific research on ostensibly paranormal phenomena, so as to explore the history and current status of psychological investigations into people's anomalous experiences.

The Theatre of England and Ireland T4785

Theatre studies leap from page to stage, providing analytic and experiential learning opportunities, as students investigate historical and contemporary cultural roles of theatre in England and in Ireland.



T4790 Digging Deep for Water and Cultural Exposure through Service-Learning in Ghana

Accra and Duori

Engage with people cross culturally through service-learning in Ghana by carrying out a community-based water project while experiencing new and challenging contexts traversing socio-linguistic, economic, political and geographic borders.

T4789 Natural History and Conservation Biology of Tanzania Cindy Johnson, Gustavus Adolphus College, and Thad Peterson

Serengeti National Park, Ngorongoro Crater, Tarangire National Park, Arusha, Pembe Abwe

This course/camping safari will allow students to observe and study the world's largest population of free-ranging mega fauna and visit traditional Tanzanian cultures while confronting issues of traditional economies, land ethics, wildlife conservation, subsistence, over-population and exploitation

This course seeks to enrich students' awareness of the nuclear crisis in East Asia as well as the rising global influence of Korea and Japan.

T4793 Hindu and Buddhist Art, Architecture and Mythology in the Kathmandu Valley

Kathmandu, Patan, Bodhnath, Bhaktapur and Panauti

Learn about Hindu and Buddhist mythology and philosophy in the living museum of the Kathmandu Valley's superb religious art and architecture.

T4794 Resisting the Legacy of Colonialism: Indigenous Culture, Language and Literature in New Zealand/Aotearoa

Auckland, Rotorua, Wellington

This course will examine the history of the Maori and the ways that the Maori today have negotiated post-colonial space in their work to revitalize a culture and language that were nearly destroyed by European colonization, in the process producing some remarkable literature.
