

### Welcome, Dakota Conference Presenters and Attendees!

Join with the Center for Western Studies as we observe the 75th anniversary of America's entrance into World War II. On December 8, 1941, following the bombing of Pearl Harbor, the Congress of the United States declared war on Japan. Within days, Italy and then Germany declared war on the U.S. The 48th Dakota Conference is dedicated to those American men and women who served their country and all humankind when freedom from oppression, genocide, and fascism weighed in the balance. Many presentations this year explore the impact of the war, in many of its manifestations, on South Dakota and other states in the Northern Plains.

Leading Great Plains historian R. Douglas Hurt, author of *The Great Plains during World War II*, headlines the conference, speaking at the Friday dinner about the cattle industry that provided meat to the soldiers. Professor and head of the Department of History at Purdue University, Indiana, Dr. Hurt is also the author of *The Big Empty: The Great Plains in the Twentieth Century* and *The Indian Frontier, 1763-1846*.

In conjunction with this conference theme, the Center for Western Studies commissioned John E. Miller, South Dakota State University (Emeritus), to conduct interviews with war veterans, which he will discuss at the opening luncheon address. The closing session will feature Augustana Writer-in-Residence Patrick Hicks, who will present material related to his research on B-17 crews, many of whose radio operators were trained at the Sioux Falls Army Air Technical School.

Dedicated to examining contemporary issues in their historical and cultural contexts, the Dakota Conference is a signature event of the Center for Western Studies, whose programming focuses on the Northern Plains region of the American West. ## Award for Distinguished Contribution to the Preservation of the Cultural Heritage of the Northern Plains

## Thomas J. Gasque, Ph.D.



Thomas J. Gasque, Ph.D., is professor emeritus of English at the University of South Dakota. At the university, he taught courses in medieval literature, history of the language, place names, and Lewis and Clark, as well as general courses in British literature.

Tom has been involved in the study of place names for over thirty years, his interest beginning when he got to know Dr. Edward Ehrensperger (1895–1984), the editor of the 1941 WPA book *South Dakota Place Names* and a founder of the American Name Society. At Dr. Ehrensperger's request, he agreed to totally revise and update the 1941 study, a project which remains incomplete though still promised. Meanwhile, he became ac-

tive in the American Name Society and served as editor of its journal and later a term as president and several terms as secretary.

He has been a frequent presenter at the Dakota Conference, most often on some aspect of South Dakota names or names of the Northern Plains. He is the recipient of the Herbert W. Blakely Award (professional category) for the paper he presented at the 2013 conference, "Hispanic Place Names in the Upper Midwest." In retirement, he and his wife, Alice, also a retired USD professor, live in Columbia, SC, but as often as possible return to South Dakota to visit friends and attend the conference.

# Continue Your Research on World War II with Primary Resources in the Center for Western Studies Archives

#### ARMY AIR FORCES TECHNICAL SCHOOL IN SIOUX FALLS, SD

**Edward Scribner Collection:** Base newspapers including three volumes of *The Polar Tech* and one volume of *The Sioux Sentinel*, spanning the years 1942-1945.

**William B. and Alice Mauschbaugh Collection:** Examples of printing projects completed by the base's Drafting and Reproduction Division, including general manuals about life on the base, the base newsletter, propaganda posters, and post events. M/Sgt Mauschbaugh served in the division.

**Marcia Fossum Collection:** Pamphlets including a USO calendar of events for soldiers' wives, "Pfc. Gweep at Radio School" booklet, and a yearbook for Class One.

#### **LETTERS HOME FROM OVERSEAS**

**Richard Cropp Collection:** Includes war letters to wife and parents by Capt. (later Maj.) Richard Cropp, who served with the 147th Field Artillery in the Pacific; also papers related to his official duties and newsletters of the *Willard A. Holbrook* during the December 1941 voyage to Australia.

**Lester C. Froke Collection:** Transcripts of weekly letters by Lester C. Froke to his parents during service in the army (1941-1945) and a manuscript about his experiences. Froke worked on the theory and application of radar for a British unit during the war. He spent time at many camps across the United States, including in Hawaii and Guam, and witnessed the bombing of London.

**Dale J. Simons Collection:** Photographs and official correspondence of Dale J. Simons, who served as chaplain at the army air base at Tarawa in the Gilbert Islands (1944-1946); also issues of base newsletters.

**Glenn E. "Doc" Soladay Collection:** Correspondence, documents, photographs, and artifacts documenting Glenn Soladay's experiences with the 147th Field Artillery Regiment in Australia and New Guinea. Highlights include Japanese propaganda and photographs depicting the mobilization of B Battery from Mitchell, SD, to Fort Ord, CA, in late 1940; also letters to Glenn from his Australian girlfriends and letters he exchanged with his mother, who contributed to the war effort by working in a munitions factory.

**Yeager Family Collection:** World War II-era love letters between long-time *Argus Leader* editor Anson Yeager and his wife, Ada May. At the time, Anson was serving in the Army and Ada May in the Navy WAVES; also Anson's letters to his mother and the couple's military papers. Of special note are materials from Anson Yeager's service in Japan during the Allied occupation.

**U.S.S. South Dakota Oral History Project:** Oral history interviews with 31 veterans who served on the *U.S.S. South Dakota* during the war.

**Augustana Student Organization for Historical Studies:** Oral history interviews with nine World War II veterans for the Library of Congress Veterans History Project.


